A look at why our government refuses to

SECURE OUR BORDERS!

The Invasion

Conservative estimates show 14 million illegal aliens now living in the U.S., the combined populations of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, North and South Dakota. Some estimates go as high as 30 million. Zogby, Pew, Roper and Dobbs polls show that a stunning 80 to 95 percent of Americans demand our borders be closed.

During the first 6 years of the Bush administration, 6 million intruders were caught on our southern border. One in 12 had a criminal record. Behind them, waiting to see if Bush will grant amnesty or secure the border, are the world's 4 billion to 5 billion people whose average income is less than that of Mexico.

In 2005, 155,000 OTMs ("other than Mexicans"), triple the number of 2003, from Latin America, the Middle East, Africa and Asia, were caught. Four out of five never appeared in court. They vanished into our midst.

While in Mexico earlier this year, President Bush told the Mexican people that he will "work as hard as I possibly can" to pass an amnesty bill saying: "My pledge to you and your government... to the people of Mexico, is I will work as hard as I possibly can to pass comprehensive immigration reform."

In making this "pledge" to the people of another country and leaders of a foreign government President Bush has shown contempt not only for the immigration laws of the United States, and the will of the people, but also for the very Constitution he swore to uphold.

Constitution Party National Chairman Jim Clymer said Bush's remarks were a "serious indication of just where our president's loyalties lie", adding: "The President has minimized the criminal, economic and social fallout of his administration's failed immigration policy. It is not a benign "migration" but an out and out invasion" Clymer further added.

In an April 2007 press release the Constitution Party warned Americans that "push has come to shove in the battle against illegal immigration and it's apparent Americans have been 'thrown under the bus' by their own president."

The Security and Prosperity Partnership (SPP)

In March of 2005, at a summit meeting in Waco, Texas, President George W. Bush, Mexican President Vicente Fox and Canadian Prime Minister Paul Martin issued a joint statement announcing the creation of the “Security and Prosperity Partnership of North America” (SPP).

In his May 2006 article exposing the formation of the SPP, author and columnist Jerome Corsi stated “This is not a theoretical exercise being prepared so it can be submitted for review. Instead, SPP is producing an action agreement to be implemented directly by regulations, without any envisioned direct Congressional oversight.” In his New York Times best seller, *The Late Great U.S.A: The Coming Merger with Mexico and Canada*, Corsi contends “The Security and Prosperity Partnership is not just unconstitutional, but an act of treason at the highest levels.”

On August 20 & 21, 2007, leaders of the three countries met for another secretive summit. The meeting was held at the Fairmont Le Chateau resort in the middle of rural Quebec.

According to an August 21, 2007 World Net Daily article, the resort had been surrounded by a double security fence – chain link on the outside perimeter and what appeared to be a thick-mesh wire barrier dotted with live security cameras. Within the compound, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police were clearly in command, and busloads of heavily armed Sûreté du Québec, the provincial police, had been dispatched throughout the compound. Military presence, both U.S. and Canadian, also was evident, although low-key.

Even within the compound, the press was limited to a specified area, with no apparent access to the SPP working group meetings, except for an occasional photo op with the three national leaders.

President Bush, when asked by a Fox News reporter for explicit denial of a plan to integrate the three countries, demurred and ridiculed opponents instead. Dr. Jerome Corsi commented: “That’s exactly the same type of response Europeans got from their leaders, even as the EU noose was tightening around the necks of the millions who wanted nothing to do with a European super-state”.

While the Department of Commerce disregards requests for information about the SPP, the Mexican government is more forthcoming. On their website, the SPP is described as “a permanent, trilateral process to create a major integration of North America.”

A 2005 report from the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) spells out a five-year plan for the “establishment by 2010 of a North American” economic and security community. This “community” would eventually have the power to overturn any Congressional, Executive, or Judicial decision reached by the American Government!

The North American Union (NAU)

While the leaders of the U.S., Mexico and Canada were meeting in secret at Montebello, the Coalition to Block the North American Union conducted a news conference in Ottawa on Aug. 20, 2007, to protest the SPP.

At that conference, Howard Phillips, chairman of the Conservative Caucus and founder of the Constitution Party, likened the actions of the three national leaders to those of the organizers of the European Union – “In similar fashion, behind closed doors, step-by-step, the leaders of Mexico, Canada, and the United States are setting the stage for, first, a North American Community and, ultimately, a North American Union (NAU), in which new transnational bodies would gain authority over our economy, our judiciary, and our lawmaking institutions.”

Phillips went on to say that “Advocates of the Security and Prosperity Partnership (SPP) acknowledge that economic integration is their objective, and that they favor the eventual establishment of a border around the perimeters of Canada and Mexico, with no border control separating the United States and Mexico, or the United States and Canada.”

“That is what the elites of the United States, Canada, and Mexico have in mind for us. That helps explain why the Montebello meeting is being held behind closed doors, with little access to SPP deliberations by the general public or even by the media and elected politicians from the three countries. That is why the COALITION TO BLOCK THE NORTH AMERICAN UNION of which I am Chairman is conducting this news conference . . .”

“Our message is 'President Bush, President Calderon, Prime Minister Harper, tear down the wall of silence and let the people see what you are scheming to do!'”

Popular entertainer Pat Boone, U.S. Congressmen Virgil Goode (R-VA), Ron Paul (R-TX) and Walter B. Jones (R-North Carolina) also released statements at the news conference. Congressman Jones, an original sponsor of House Concurrent Resolution 40 which opposes the North American Union and the NAFTA Superhighway, stated that "Article I, Section 8, of the U.S. Constitution explicitly states that Congress - not the executive branch - has the power to 'regulate commerce with foreign nations.' Many SPP working group meetings are held in secret and the public, the press, and members of Congress have no opportunity to participate or conduct oversight."

The leaders of Canada, the United States, and Mexico will issue denials but the hidden motive propelling them into creating the Security and Prosperity Partnership is to advance one step closer to the centuries-old goal of a world government, also known as the New World Order.

The plan is obviously to knit together the North American Union completely under the radar, through a process of regulations and directives issued by various U.S. government agencies.

Dr. Jerome Corsi sums the matter up well in the following quotes:

"Bush's goal to create a North American Union – with no borders, a shared currency (the Amero), and utterly no voice for average Americans in their own futures – is the real reason he won't enforce immigration laws."

"Anyone who cares about the future of this country – our children's future – must act now against a North American Union and the underhanded way in which our sovereignty is being compromised, one illegal alien at a time."

The Constitution Party is the only political party with a resolution to oppose the SPP/NAU scheme as a threat to America's constitutional government.
